

## Marine Notice No. 04 of 2017

*Notice to all Shipowners, Fishing Vessel Owners, Agents, Shipmasters, Skippers, Fishermen, Yachtsmen and Seafarers*

***This Marine Notice should be read in conjunction with MN 34 of 2016***

Drilling and blasting and dredging of bedrock, construction of break water and revetment, installation of piles and pontoons and other associated works at Rossaveal Fishery Harbour Centre.

The Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport has been advised by Cronin Millar (a ByrneLooby Company) of the drilling and blasting and removal of bedrock, construction of breakwater and revetment, installation of piles and pontoons and other associated works at Rossaveal Fishery Harbour Centre (Cashla Bay), Co. Galway. The works commenced on Monday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of August 2016 ([Notice No. 34 of 2016](#)) and will finish in July 2017.

Dumping at sea activities (notified in Notice No 34 of 2016) have finished. Drilling and blasting of bedrock, installation of piles, and installation of pontoons is ongoing. Works are being carried out from causeways, a jack up barge and work boats.

All vessels will be listening on VHF Ch 16 throughout the project.
